

- roots Evergreen, clinging vine Can form a dense groundcover or shrub to 3 feet in height, or climb vertical surfaces with the aid of aerial
- Leaves are opposite, dark green, shiny, and egg-shaped, from 1-2 ½ inches long, with toothed margins and silvery veins
- Clusters of inconspicuous greenlandscaping throughout Monroe stalk in mid-summer Invades forests from escaped white flowers are produced on a long
